



TRANSITION TO PRACTICE TRAINEE LEARNING PLAN

A Transition to Practice (TTP) Trainee Learning Plan must be submitted to the Regional Training Committee for review and approval no less than six months prior to the Core Orthopaedics Stage Review and subsequent progression to TTP (i.e. Prior to the RTC's August meeting if the intention is to commence TTP in February of the following year).

Ideally the plan is completed by the trainee, and reviewed by the Trainee's current supervisor (and proposed TTP Accredited Fellowship Post Supervisor where relevant) prior to submitting for review and approval by the RTC.

Progress with the plan will be monitored during 6-monthly Progress Reviews during TTP.
