<b>Educational goals and characteristics</b>	<p>The Musculoskeletal Institute Fellowship is a full-time 1.0 EFT (38 hours per week) position based primarily at Epworth Richmond with some travel to other accredited Epworth Hospitals.</p> <p>The Fellowship covers all aspects of lower limb surgery including arthroscopy, sports surgery, and primary and revision arthroplasty.</p> <p>The Fellow will work under the auspices of the Epworth Musculoskeletal Institute. There will be opportunity for clinical and basic science research alongside Doctoral, Masters and AMS students.</p> <p>After completing the fellowship would be expected to be proficient in computer navigated joint replacement, minimally invasive hip and knee surgery and the use of a variety of implants for partial and total joint replacements.</p>	
<b>Requirements/ criteria</b>	<p>A medical qualification (MBBS or equivalent) which is recognised for registration by the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency</p> <p>Applicants must have either completed their orthopaedic training (FRACS or equivalent, MS/DNB, American Board or equivalent) or must be in their final year of</p>	

	<p>training.</p> <p>International candidates must have completed the IELTS English language test with a minimum score of 7 in every section (or equivalent English test accepted by AHPRA) This is a strict criterion for registration with the Medical Board of Australia. Graduates from universities in the USA, Canada, UK, NZ and Australia are exempt. Previous arthroscopy experience is advantageous but not essential. Similarly, previous exposure to arthroplasty techniques will benefit but not essential.</p>
