<b>Educational goals and characteristics</b>	<p>This exciting opportunity is based at the new Royal Adelaide Hospital which is a major trauma hospital accepting referrals from all of South Australia and interstate.</p> <p>As the Pelvic Fellow the goal of the fellowship is to gain experience in Pelvic fractures and complex trauma under the direct supervision of experienced sub-specialised Orthopaedic surgeons. Approximately 100 pelvic and acetabular fractures are fixed per year and the pelvic fellow will be able to be involved in all cases.</p> <p>There will be an opportunity to perform more routine fractures as part of the general on-call commitments. The role includes teaching of the more junior Orthopaedic registrars and medical students. On call requirements include being second on call for a junior registrar on average once per week and 1:4 weekend days.</p> <p>The fellow will also hold an honorary position at the University of Adelaide as a Clinical Lecturer and will be expected to be involved in many research projects including clinical, cadaver and basic science.</p>
