



Clinical Fellowship in Foot and Ankle Surgery (VIC2503284)

Educational Goals:

The purpose of the fellowship is to provide specialist training in foot & ankle orthopaedic surgery to an orthopaedic surgeon wishing to sub-specialise. It is anticipated that the fellow will have completed a prior fellowship in foot & ankle surgery as there will be an expectation that the fellow will participate in independent operating sessions (after an appropriate period of supervision).

The fellowship offers exposure to the full gamut of orthopaedic foot and ankle surgical procedures, including but not limited to:

- Management of foot and ankle trauma including complex foot & ankle trauma.
- Total ankle arthroplasty
- Deformity correction
- Forefoot correction
- Arthroscopy and ligament reconstruction

There will also be opportunity to run independent trauma operating sessions and participate in the consultant on-call roster for both adult and paediatric trauma and if doing so, after a period of appropriate supervision and sign off, to manage general orthopaedic trauma cases as an independent surgeon.

It is also anticipated that the fellow will contribute to a minimum of one research publication during the fellowship term.

Educational Qualifications/Requirements:

The ideal applicant for this fellowship will have already finished general orthopaedic training, and will have had exposure to lower limb surgery, either during general training or in previous lower limb fellowships. To gain maximum benefit from the fellowship, the trainee should already be fluent in the basics of adult foot & ankle surgery and have completed a prior fellowship in this field. and wish to further explore a particular avenue or avenues in foot and ankle surgery.

The applicant must:

- Be eligible for registration with the Medical Board of Australia (AHPRA)
- Have the appropriate level of post graduate orthopaedic training
- Have demonstrated a high standard of clinical practice
- Have demonstrated professional integrity
- Have demonstrated the ability to work in a multidisciplinary team environment
- Have demonstrated commitment to quality improvement
- Have demonstrated ability to be adaptable to change
- Have clinical experience appropriate to the year of training
- Have experience in scientific and/or clinical research
- Have knowledge of appropriate clinical standards
- Have knowledge of policies, protocols and procedures to ensure acceptable practices
- Have knowledge of foot and ankle surgical techniques
- Have evidence of research experience, including evidence of relevant published research
