Educational goals and characteristics	<p>This fellowship provides comprehensive subspecialty training in the diagnosis and management of musculoskeletal conditions affecting children and adolescents. The program is designed to equip fellows with the advanced clinical knowledge and surgical skills necessary to excel in a high-level academic or private practice setting. The training is structured across limb reconstruction and deformity correction, general paediatric orthopaedics, and hip preservation.</p>	
Requirements/ criteria	<p>To apply for the fellowship, applicants must first have earned a medical degree (MD or equivalent) and successfully completed a multi-year accredited residency program in orthopaedic surgery. Candidates are typically required to be board-certified or board-eligible in orthopaedic surgery, signifying they have met the national standards of competency in their field. The application process itself is highly competitive and involves submitting a detailed curriculum vitae (CV), a personal statement expressing their specific interest in paediatric care, and strong letters of recommendation from supervising faculty during their residency. In essence, these prerequisites are designed to select candidates who have already proven their capability as competent orthopaedic surgeons and are ready for advanced, specialized training in the care of children.</p>
