The fellow will have the opportunity to be involved in the assessment and management of knee disorders, both surgical and non-surgical, as well as the ongoing care of these patients. There is extensive exposure to knee sports medicine reconstructive techniques, including ligament reconstruction, patellofemoral surgery, cartilage restorative techniques and osteotomy surgery as well as knee arthroplasty surgery including unicompartmental, total knee and revision knee procedures. The other major objective of the fellowship program is completing at least one research project that will be suitable for publication in a peer-reviewed orthopaedic journal. Secondary research topics will also be provided.
