<b>Educational goals and characteristics</b>	<p>Fellow will be directly involved in the daily care and operative treatment of foot and ankle, orthopaedic lower limb trauma and late reconstruction procedures in a large tertiary referral centre. Fellow coordinates multi-trauma care and involved with complex surgical demands.</p> <p>At the successful completion of the Fellowship, it is anticipated that the Fellow will be competent in assessing and diagnosing a wide range of musculoskeletal injuries and conditions and be capable of implementing and monitoring the surgical and non-surgical management of patients with these injuries and conditions.</p> <p>Overseeing and assisting in multiple research projects throughout the year, resulting in publication and presentation of research work.</p> <p>Attendance/involvement in training workshops/meetings</p> <p>The fellows will be exposed to fellowship-trained foot and ankle surgeons and fellowship-trained trauma and limb reconstruction surgeons.</p>	
<b>Requirements/ criteria</b>	<p>Appointment to this position requires proof of qualification and registration or membership with the appropriate registration authority or association within Australia.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- MBBS, MD or equivalent registrable with the Medical Board of Australia</li> <li>- Applicants must have completed the appropriate specialist training program in their country or be in their final year completing elective study. Eligibility is on the basis of a FRACS or equivalent prior to commencement of the Fellowship</li> </ul> <p>Mandatory background checks, up to date vaccination history required.</p> <p>Fellows whose education was not completed entirely in a country where English is the first language will need to demonstrate their English language proficiency through attaining a minimum score of 7 in all units of an International English Language Testing System (IELTS) test, in keeping with AHPRA's medical registration standards. This is to be passed prior to applying.</p>	
<b>How to Apply</b>	<p><b>APPLICATIONS ONLY ACCEPTED DURING RECRUITMENT PHASE</b> - Advertised through PAH website, Smart Jobs, SEEK and Metro South Weekly Job Vacancies.</p> <p>Applications, including a current curriculum vitae and the names of three referees. A determination on the successful applicant is usually made five months prior to the commencement of the fellowship in February.</p>
