Fellow coordinates multi-trauma care and involved with complex surgical demands. At the successful completion of the Fellowship, it is anticipated that the Fellow will be competent in assessing and diagnosing a wide range of musculoskeletal injuries and conditions and be capable of implementing and monitoring the surgical and non-surgical management of patients with these injuries and conditions. Overseeing and assisting in multiple research projects throughout the year, resulting in publication and presentation of research work. Attendance/involvement in training workshops/meetings The fellows will be exposed to fellowship-trained foot and ankle surgeons and fellowship-trained trauma and limb reconstruction surgeons.	
Requirements/ criteria	 Appointment to this position requires proof of qualification and registration or membership with the appropriate registration authority or association within Australia. MBBS, MD or equivalent registrable with the Medical Board of Australia Applicants must have completed the appropriate specialist training program in their country or be in their final year completing elective study. Eligibility is on the basis of a FRACS or equivalent prior to commencement of the Fellowship Mandatory background checks, up to date vaccination history required. Fellows whose education was not completed entirely in a country where English is the first language will need to demonstrate their English language proficiency through attaining a minimum score of 7 in all units of an International English Language Testing System (IELTS) test, in keeping with AHPRA's medical registration standards. This is to be passed prior to applying.
