Depending on the level of experience on entry to the Fellowship program, it is anticipated that the Paediatric Orthopaedic Fellow (on completion of 12 months training) would be proficient in the acute surgical management of paediatric trauma, paediatric hip conditions, foot and ankle, cerebral palsy, reconstruction, paediatric upper limb and paediatric sport knee conditions.
