| Educational goals and characteristics | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The aim of the Fellowship is to provide extensive exposure in both elective and trauma surgery. • The elective component will predominantly cover hip and knee surgery. • The trauma component will cover general trauma surgery as well as subspecialised spine and pelvic trauma surgery. • Elective exposure over the 6-month term will provide sub-speciality training in the following procedures: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Primary and revision total hip and knee arthroplasty (approx. 500 cases/yr) ○ Unicompartamental knee arthroplasty (approx. 30 cases/yr) ○ Sports knee surgery – meniscal repair, primary and revision ACL reconstruction (HS, quads, and BPTB), multiligament knee reconstruction, chondral and meniscal transplantation, patellofemoral stabilisation, femoral and tibial osteotomy surgery (approx. 250 cases/yr) • Fellows will be expected to attend the morning trauma meetings and be actively involved in the management of the more complex trauma cases. • Fellows will be supervised and encouraged to take the primary surgeon role in both elective and trauma cases. • Fellows will be expected to attend elective and complex trauma clinics. • Fellows will have the opportunity to be involved in after hours on-call trauma service which will provide additional income at higher rates. • Fellows will be encouraged to attend meetings and conferences relevant to their training. • Research opportunities are available for fellow's and they will be encouraged to participate. | |
