Educational goals and characteristics	• The aim of the Fellowship is to provide extensive exposure in both elective and trauma surgery. • The elective component will predominantly cover hip and knee surgery. • The trauma component will cover general trauma surgery as well as subspecialised spine and pelvic trauma surgery. • Elective exposure over the 6-month term will provide sub-speciality training in the following procedures: ○ Primary and revision total hip and knee arthroplasty (approx. 500 cases/yr) ○ Unicompartmental knee arthroplasty (approx. 30 cases/yr) ○ Sports knee surgery – meniscal repair, primary and revision ACL reconstruction (HS, quads, and BPTB), multiligament knee reconstruction, chondral and meniscal transplantation, patellofemoral stabilisation, femoral and tibial osteotomy surgery (approx. 250 cases/yr) • Fellows will be expected to attend the morning trauma meetings and be actively involved in the management of the more complex trauma cases. • Fellows will be supervised and encouraged to take the primary surgeon role in both elective and trauma cases. • Fellows will be expected to attend elective and complex trauma clinics. • Fellows will have the opportunity to be involved in after hours on-call trauma service which will provide additional income at higher rates. • Fellows will be encouraged to attend meetings and conferences relevant to their training. • Research opportunities are available for fellow's and they will be encouraged to participate.	

Requirements/ criteria	• APHRA registration • Fully qualified orthopaedic surgeons, or within 12 months of completing with FRACS or equivalent qualification from Australia, New Zealand or UK only. • English language proficiency minimum score of 7 in all units of an International English Language Testing System (IELTS) test, in keeping with AHPRA's medical registration standards. This is to be passed prior to applying.
