Educational Goals and Characteristics	<p>The shoulder fellowship is a 12-month fellowship designed to teach the Fellow the surgical practice of shoulder surgery, including both Arthroscopy and Arthroplasty.</p> <p>At the completion of the Fellowship, Fellows will be comfortable with all basic aspects of shoulder arthroscopy and gain familiarity with more advanced techniques such as arthroscopic Latarjet. Further, the Fellow will become comfortable with anatomical and reverse total shoulder replacement surgery and have a good understanding of the principles of revision surgery.</p> <p>The Fellow will be expected to be competent in trauma surgery and will be exposed to dealing with complex revision shoulder cases.</p> <p>The Fellowship offers significant exposure to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Shoulder arthroplasty • Shoulder Trauma • Shoulder sports and arthroscopic surgery <p>The Fellow is expected to submit a research paper for publication during the fellowship.</p>	

Requirements/Criteria	<p>The ideal applicant will already have finished general orthopaedic training and will have had exposure to shoulder surgery, either during general training or in previous upper limb fellowships. To benefit from the fellowship, the trainee should already be fluent in the basics, and wish to further explore a particular avenue or avenues in shoulder surgery.</p> <p>The applicant must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Be eligible for registration with the Medical Board of Australia (AHPRA) • Have the appropriate level of post graduate orthopaedic training • Have demonstrated a high standard of clinical practice • Have demonstrated professional integrity • Have demonstrated the ability to work in a multidisciplinary team environment • Have demonstrated commitment to quality improvement • Have demonstrated ability to be adaptable to change • Have the clinical experience appropriate to the year of training • Have experience in scientific and/or clinical research • Have knowledge of appropriate clinical standards • Have knowledge of shoulder surgical techniques • Have evidence of research experience, including evidence of relevant published research • Demonstrated desire to continue practicing in shoulder surgery in their professional life • Excellent English is necessary (IELTS with a minimum individual band score of 7 must be obtained with 2 years of commencement of Fellowship) • Proven satisfactory clinical performance supported by submission of two current referee reports
