Educational goals and characteristics	The upper limb fellowship provides fellows with training and practical application in all aspects of hand and upper limb surgery. Assessment and management of complex upper limb trauma is emphasised. The fellowship provides extensive exposure to surgeries ranging from digital replant surgery to shoulder arthroplasty.	
	The fellowship allows and encourages opportunities for both clinical and basic science research. The fellowship is based at Princess Alexandra Hospital but includes private assisting opportunities at various private hospitals in Brisbane. This gives fellows a broad exposure to all aspects of upper limb surgery including microsurgery, arthroscopy and arthroplasty. Research opportunities exist through the Fellowship's ties with the Brisbane Hand and Upper Limb Research Institute, the Queensland University of Technology (QUT) and the University of Queensland. There is also access to the biomechanics laboratory at QUT and an animal research facility.	

Requirements/criteria	Medical degree and specialist qualification as an orthopaedic surgeon recognisable by Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA) for appropriate registration in an educational fellowship.	
	As this is a clinical fellowship, good interpersonal skills and English language competency are required. IELTS pass of 7 or above in all four components is mandatory.
