	At the successful completion of the Fellowship it is anticipated that the Fellow will be competent in assessing and diagnosing a wide range of musculoskeletal injuries and conditions and be capable of implementing and monitoring the surgical and non-surgical management of patients with these injuries and conditions.	
	The fellow will be involved in the daily commitments of the Orthopaedic unit, as part of a multi-disciplinary team. The Fellow will be rostered to the On-Call Emergency Trauma Roster, subject to demonstration of appropriate skills and experience.
