Active Sessions

The Active Sessions section allows you to view all devices and browsers that are currently signed in to your account.

This helps you:

- keep track of where your account is being accessed,
- identify devices you no longer use,
- and quickly sign out of sessions you do not recognize.

For example, you may see sessions from:

- your mobile phone,
- home laptop,
- work computer,
- or tablet.

Each session may display information such as:

- device type,
- browser,
- approximate location,
- and last activity time.

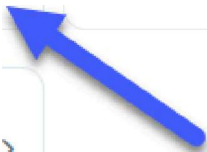
After you login

1. Hover over your name in the top-right corner of the page.
2. Select Manage Account.

Managing Your Sessions

From the Active Sessions section, you can:

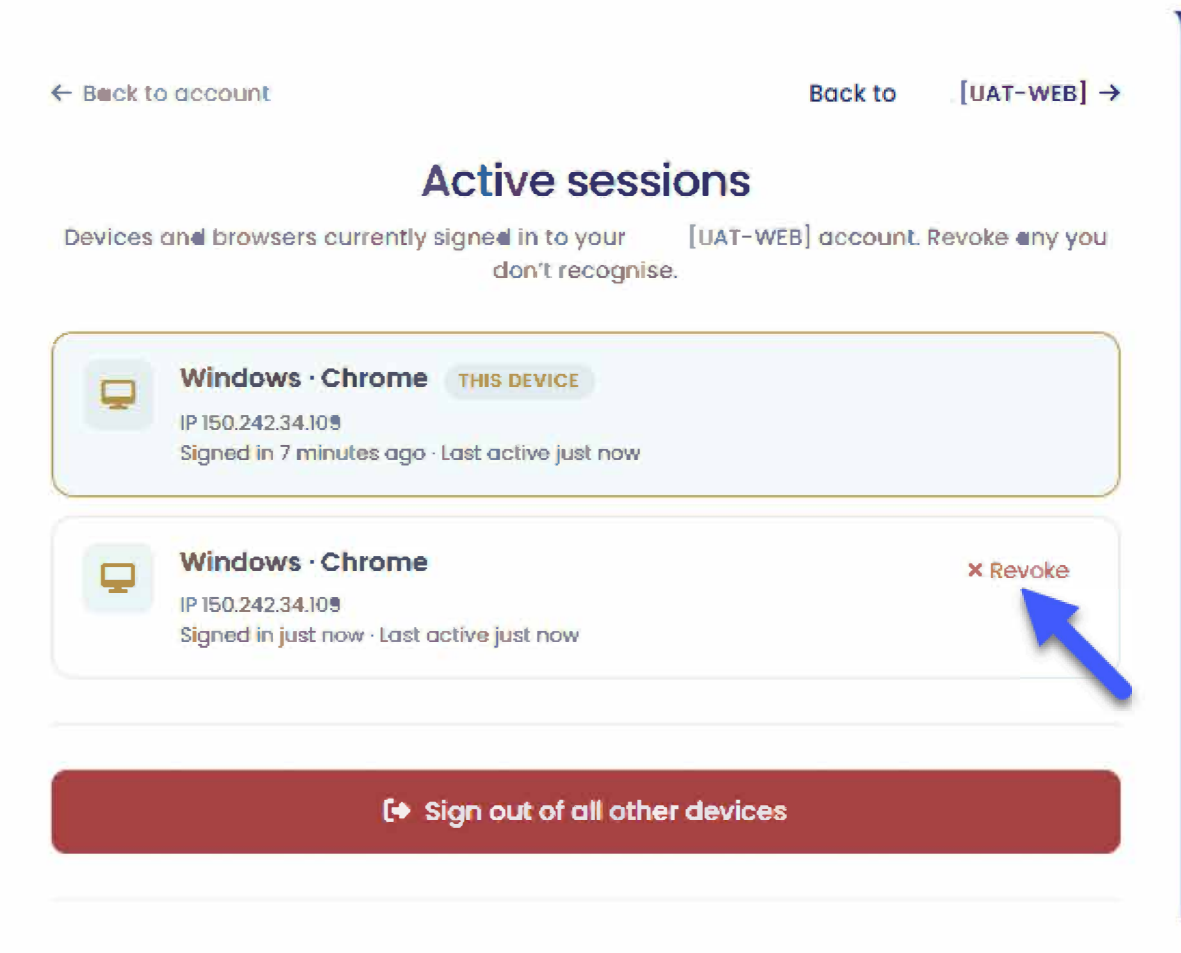
Sign Out of a Specific Session

You can remotely sign out of individual sessions that are no longer needed.

For security reasons, you cannot remove the session you are currently using to access your profile.

This is useful if:

- you forgot to sign out on another device,
- you replaced an old phone or computer,
- or you notice a session you do not recognize.



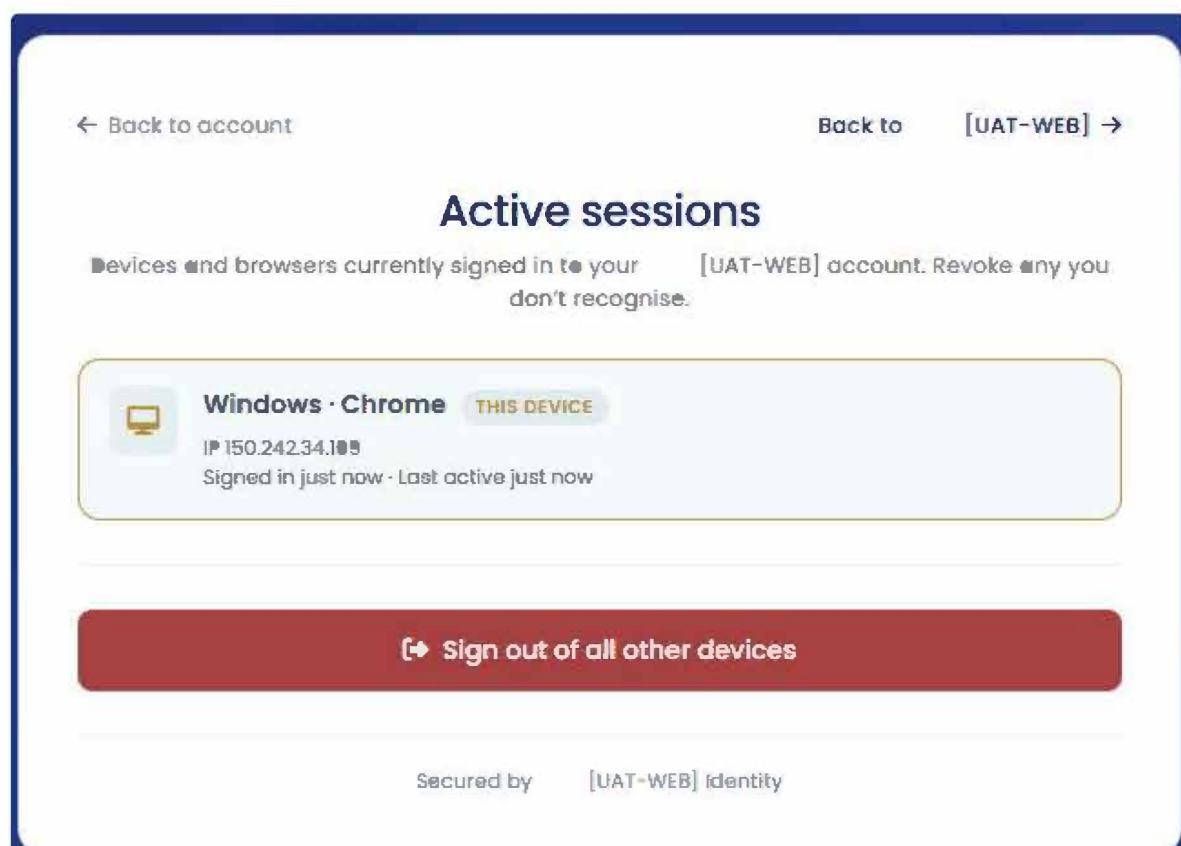
Sign Out of All Other Sessions

You can also choose to sign out of all sessions at once, except for your current session.

This option is useful if:

- you believe someone else may have access to your account,
- you recently changed your password,
- or you simply want to refresh and secure your account access.

After signing out of other sessions, those devices will need to log in again and complete any required authentication steps.



Why Active Sessions Are Important

Reviewing your active sessions regularly can help improve account security by:

- showing you where your account is signed in,
- helping detect unauthorized access,
- and giving you control over connected devices.

If you see a session you do not recognize, it is recommended to:

1. sign out of that session,
2. change your password,
3. and ensure two-factor authentication is enabled.
